

Outrun Hunger

Rachel's Table of Western Massachusetts and Rachel's Table Teen Board asked the community to come out and Outrun Hunger on May 19 at Forest Park! The 5k race and 1-mile family-friendly walk in one day helps RTWM fight hunger all year long in Hampden, Hampshire and Franklin Counties. PJ Library also sponsored a story walk to share with younger friends the mitzvah (good deed) of giving back to the community. Over 130 participants came to walk, run, dance with Boomer of the Springfield Thunderbirds, listen to music by DJ Matt of Peterson Productions, and eat popcorn, bagels and fruit – donated by PeoplesBank, Alex's Bagels and InterProduce. RTWM is thankful to the Harold Grinspoon Foundation for supporting the Teen Board – a group of teens dedicated to educating themselves and others about food insecurity, especially childhood food insecurity, serving the local community, and advocating for change. Thank you to everyone who came out to run, walk and volunteer. It was a beautiful day!







Rescue

RTWM has rescued a lot of food since the beginning of 2024. In the spring, at Performance Food Group's Food Expo, in one night, volunteers rescued and distributed an impressive 12,127 pounds of produce, bread, bakery items, and dry goods to 21 partnering agencies.









Rescue Cont

In June, Springfield School Volunteers provided 130 boxed lunches to four partnering agencies. As summer continues, **297 pounds of milk and snacks** from Ashley School in West Springfield were distributed to partner agencies, while Longmeadow Public Schools contributed 1,481 pounds of produce, dairy, chips, snacks, bread, bakery items, sandwiches, and fruit cups to eight partnering agencies. Additionally, 196 pounds of dairy and produce from Memorial School in West Springfield were distributed to one partnering agency. Finally, JCC Early Learning Center contributed 10 pounds (11 boxes) of dry cereal.

Purchase

Since 2024, RTWM has completed three purchase programs with Jewish Family Service (JFS) for Tu BiShvat, Passover, and Shavuot. This program ensures that over 30 local Jewish families have access to kosher and holiday-appropriate food five to six times a year. Given the strong connection between food and celebration during these holidays, it is crucial to address the intersectionality of religious food observances and food insecurity. A study shows that over 60% of individuals who utilize food banks and keep kosher wish there were more variety and options to meet their lifestyle needs. This initiative is made possible by the dedicated efforts of Chana, Kathy, and the volunteers who help pick up and pack the food. Thank you to Berezin family for making this program a success. We are looking for more support financially to ensure kosher-observant families are served for most major holidays and more. There are more families who have requested this service - call the office if you can help!

In February, Friends of the Homeless (FOH) hosted a Winter Seed Sowing workshop. Together, FOH residents and Growing Gardens volunteers learned to make mini greenhouses out of milk jugs and seeded this year's FOH garden. In June, we teamed up with The Gray House and Ascentria Care Alliance to offer a SNAP education and cooking class using strawberries, fresh greens, and herbs from the garden. Students made sweet potato and black bean quesadillas with fresh fruit salsa. Special thanks to Yolanda from The Gray House and Marie Ange Laroche from Jewish Family Service of Western Massachusetts for providing Spanish and Haitian Creole interpretation, respectively.
